Prior to Camp

Prior to attending camp, campers and staff will be encouraged to self-quarantine, perform an at-home pre-screening, and provide proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test or vaccination. Campers and Staff who don't have proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test or vaccination status will not be accepted into camp.



Transportation & Check-in

It is recommended campers are driven to camp in a private vehicle, limited to the camper(s) and one guardian. Drop-off and pick-up will be a drive-thru service with scheduled times. Passengers may be asked to remain in the car and are subject to COVID-19 symptoms screening, physical distancing, and masking.



COVID-19 Screenings

At check-in to camp, campers will be asked to confirm the answers to our COVID-19 screening questions and temperature check. Each camper and staff will have their symptoms and temperature checked daily and will have their symptoms and temperature checked daily. Campers and staff who test positive on arrival day will not be allowed to stay at camp.



Podding, Masking & Physical Distancing

Camp will be broken down into pods of 3-5 cabins per pod. A cabin of 6-10 campers and 1-2 staff is the number of different people your child will interact with without the need for masking and physical distancing. All campers and staff are required to wear face masks and maintain physical distance when inside common buildings and interacting with other cabins or pods. Campers will be encouraged to bring 5 masks with them to camp. Masks will be provided to those not bringing their own.



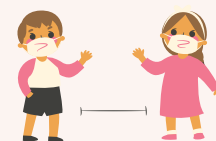
Disinfecting & Handwashing

Cascade Camp Cedarbrook & Camp Koinonia will follow the disinfecting and cleaning protocols suggested by the ACA, and WA Department of Health. Extra ventilation has been added to cabins. Regular hand-washing will be incorporated into our daily schedule. Sanitizer is readily available throughout camp.



Altered Programming

Group activities such as program area rotations, evening games, and campfires will be altered to adhere to smaller group sizes and physical distancing. Overnights will be limited and wilderness experiences will still take place.



Food Service

Food will be served by our staff cafeteria-style. Cabins will eat in shifts by pods to maintain reduced capacities in our indoor dining spaces. Campers and staff will be encouraged to eat outside when space and weather allows.



Leadership Trips

While on camp grounds, Leadership campers will belong to their own pod. All COVID-19 protocols will be adhered to when traveling off main camp. Cabins will have lodging and shared equipment that will be disinfected regularly. Monitoring and evacuation plans are in place if a group member displays symptoms.



Non-WA Residents

At this time, international staff and campers are permitted. Per CDC guidelines, a negative COVID-19 test is required for US entry. We will continue to follow CDC, ACA, and WA Department of Health Guidelines on participation for non-WA residents and internationals.
